Marxist, Leninist, or Stalinist? Julius Fučík's literary criticism

Julius Fučík (1903–1943) is still well known for his role in the antinacist movement and his *Report from the Gallows* (1945, 1995) which summarizes his resistance experience. His essays and critics have the same importance for the evolution of the Czech Marxist literary criticism. And the same history, because as well as the *Report* they were misinterpreted by the

ideologues of the Czech communist regime. The task of my lecture will be, on the one hand, to show their noble efforts to renew the Fučík's image after the last party line, and on the other, to find the original meaning of his literary criticism.
